Intelligence Analyst

Working as part of a small Maritime Security and Incident Response team, you will be responsible for the intelligence processes necessary for the delivery of Maritime New Zealand's Regulatory Maritime Security Services (in accordance with the New Zealand legislative framework).

A big part of this role will be to monitor and warn of intelligence threats to New Zealand ports and ships. This will include research, collation and analysis of maritime, geo-political and related security information from all sources, and providing high quality analytical advice on maritime security issues.

You will need to have proven experience within the intelligence and security fields and be highly regarded in this industry for your knowledge and intelligence skills. You will also need to possess the highest integrity. Developing relationships is fundamental to this role as you will need to work in true partnership with law enforcement and intelligence agencies, as well as maritime industry players.

You will also assist the team in contributing to Maritime New Zealand's Incident Response capability for the managing of maritime incidents.

This will be a demanding position with high expectations to produce tailored, robust reports in a timely manner.

Ideally you will have:

- A university degree and at least three years appropriate work experience in the intelligence/border security fields.
- Knowledge and experience of government processes, planning and reporting requirements.
- Knowledge of risk assessment/profiling methodology.
- Strong analytical and problem solving ability.
- Experience in public presentation and strong interpersonal skills.
- Maintain a Top Secret Security clearance
- Experience in applying information integrity and security controls and the handling and storage of classified or sensitive information.
