GUIDELINES FOR APPLICANTS: NEW ZEALAND MASTER (YACHT)

Please note - Calculation of Sea Service:

- *A candidate shall have completed not less than 60 months total sea service in vessels of not less than 12 metres in length, 12 months of which must have been gained in the last 10 years and on voyages beyond restricted limits.*
- *24 months of this service shall be in charge of a navigational watch for not less than 8 hours out of every 24 whilst holding a Maritime New Zealand watchkeeping or suitable command Certificate of Competency. This must be correctly documented.*
- *24 months shall be gained whilst holding a NZ Chief Mate (Yacht) certificate and in charge of a navigational watch of not less than 8 out of every 24 hours.*

Notes on Sea Service:

Evidence of sea service must be by statement of service in writing from the Master/Skipper, owner or operator of the vessel. This statement should include the name, length and tonnage (if applicable) of the vessel(s) on which you have served. In addition the dates of joining and leaving the vessel or the dates and hours served should be provided in a neat and readable fashion.

Only one day's sea service can be counted in any 24 hour period no matter how many hours are worked in the 24.

For the purpose of calculating sea service 30 days is counted as one month.

Statutory declarations can be made in relation to pleasure service and in the case of **self-employed persons. (Additional proof will also be required.)** A statutory declaration **may** be accepted in certain other cases, this will be for very unusual circumstances only. The statutory declaration **must** be signed by a NZ Justice of the Peace.

In addition to completing an approved course, written examinations and passing a Maritime NZ approved oral exam, to be eligible for the issue of a certificate of competency as an NZ Master (Yacht) an applicant must satisfy and produce the following:

- An application form for a maritime qualification correctly completed.
- A completed Fit and Proper Person Questionnaire.
- A completed Consent to Disclosure form.
- Proof of 60 months sea service.
- Proof of 24 months watchkeeping service.
- A NZ Master (Yacht) Navigation and Control certificate acceptable to the Director.
- A dated testimonial, not more than 12 months old from someone who knows you well (not a family member) referring to your conduct, ability and sobriety.
- A signed and dated reference from a former employer/skipper covering the 12 months prior to the examination.
- A certificate of proficiency in charge of medical care on board ship.
- A proficiency in survival craft and rescue boats (other than fast rescue boats) certificate not more than five years old.
- A Competence in Advanced Fire Fighting certificate not more than five years old.
- A medical fitness certificate issued by a Maritime NZ approved medical practitioner.
- A standard eyesight test by a Maritime NZ approved optometrist.
- ### Application fee.

If you are uncertain as to whether the nature or duration of your sea service meets the Maritime NZ's requirements, you may contact the Maritime NZ Head Office and seek a formal assessment of your sea time by a Maritime NZ examiner. A fee may apply for this assessment.
